General Education Equivalencies

This transfer agreement illustrates course-by-course general education equivalencies between the Seattle Community College District (SCCD), consisting of North Seattle Community College, South Seattle Community College and Seattle Central Community College and the State University of New York (SUNY) College at Oneonta.

A maximum of 66 credits will be accepted from any campus or a combination of campuses within the Seattle Community College District, with a maximum of 46.9 credits towards completing SUNY Oneonta's general education requirements. Each 5 quarter credit course from Seattle Community Colleges transfers to SUNY Oneonta as an equivalent of 3.35 semester hours.

In completing the requirements as outlined with a grade of C- or better in the course, students will have met all of the general education requirements at SUNY Oneonta, as determined by the State University of New York effective Spring 2011. Students who wish to transfer major-required courses must have the course reviewed by the appropriate SUNY Oneonta department chair to determine course transferability.

Transferring students must have a minimum of a 2.0 overall GPA in order to be considered for admission for most majors. Prospective Education majors must have an overall GPA of 2.8 or higher to declare Education as their major at SUNY Oneonta. Course equivalencies attached herein do not guarantee admission to SUNY Oneonta.

International Students must apply directly to the Office of International Education (OIE) at SUNY Oneonta and are subject to the College's English proficiency requirements set by the OIE and USCIS standards.

This agreement will remain in effect until a mutually agreed-upon change is deemed necessary, at which point revisions will be proposed. Seattle Community Colleges or SUNY Oneonta may terminate this agreement with appropriate written notification.
